

## TREE PLANTING PERMIT

Identify the location of the new tree(s) in relation to other trees, sidewalks, fixtures and structures. The space between trees shall not be less than the diameter of their total mature spread.

Trees planted in the tree terrace should be planted approx.

3-1/2 feet behind the curb.

Residents are reminded that the following trees are NOT allowed in street right-of-way: black locust, box elder, catalpa, elms (except regal elms and other disease-resistant elm trees approved by the City), poplar, silver maple, willow, fruit trees, nut bearing trees, basswood, cottonwood and evergreen. If you have planted any of these types of trees in the street right-of-way, you should move them before they become too large to transplant.

Also, Residents are reminded that the City's Zoning Ordinance prohibits the planting of trees on corner lots in a protected 15 foot area of the property (see diagram). This is done to provide a clear site distance for vehicles approaching the intersection. Residents are reminded, that particularly in the case of evergreens and shrubs, their anticipated growth should be considered when planting. They create problems as they grow when they extend into the protected 15 foot area at street intersections. Plant evergreens and shrubs well behind the 15 foot protected area. The site area being protected is between 2-1/2 feet and 10 feet in height. Any landscaping in the 15 foot protected area should not exceed 2-1/2 feet in height.
